On June 17, Mainstream Living hosted a Founder's Celebration to recognize and honor the four founding families who started the organization in 1975. Ellen and Don Hadwiger, Beth and Norman Cheville, Marvin and Maxine Julius, and Robert and Jan Samuelson simply wanted what all of us want for our children. They wanted their children to live a happy and healthy life as part of the community. Fortunately, there were many parents ready to lead the way. They organized, raised money, advocated, and fought for solutions. Those solutions led to an organization that has grown dramatically in nearly five decades and that's more than a cause for celebration!

Founding members and their families from near and far joined us to celebrate. President and CEO Bill Vaughn formally recognized the contributions of the Hadwiger, Cheville, Julius, and Samuelson families. In addition to the four founding families, former President and CEO Reno Berg

was recognized. For 36 of Mainstream Living's 50 years, the organization was led by Reno. His foresight and innovation in delivering services and his mentorship to many created an organizational culture that is still in existence today.

As part of the celebration, two special pieces were created. The first was a custom art piece created by local artist Ben Schuh. The artwork, entitled "Living Mainstream", depicts the vision of our four founding families coming together to create the organization. The original piece is displayed at our Ames office, with a reprint on display at the Des Moines office. Along with the artwork, a booklet was put together chronicling the history of Mainstream Living and disability services in central lowa.
